It is somewhat unusual, however, for a school to also offer those students specialized, individual attention. These new programs are designed to recognize and meet the distinctly different needs of academically diverse students, while the school as a whole continues to provide academic excellence for all.

As a Xaverian Brothers sponsored school, Malden Catholic instills in its students a love of God, of self and of others. Christian service is an integral part of every young man's education. From volunteering at the local food bank to spending summer weeks in Peru helping the needy, Malden Catholic students actively participate in Christian service. "Malden Catholic educates students in Gospel values and the social teaching of the Church, so they are capable of making informed judgments about social issues," explains Mary Driscoll, director of campus ministry. "We form students in the attitudes, values and competencies that promote a Christian life of service and social consciousness."

A school that emphasizes the importance of personal relationships, Malden Catholic provides its 700 students with a supportive and nurturing environment. Combined with a dedicated and experienced faculty and a very high level of parental involvement, the result is a family-like community of support.

The school is home to several championship-caliber athletic teams and a wide range of extracurricular activities, ranging from a Model Congress and a championship Robotics Team to Culinary and Asian Cultures clubs.

Malden Catholic is competitively priced and offers both academic scholarships and financial assistance. The school is one of just 50 high schools to qualify

for the 2006-07 Catholic High School Honor Roll and has a strong reputation for engineering, science and mathematics. More than 50 students were inducted into the



school's National Honor Society last year, and its 2008 graduates earned acceptance to schools including Harvard, Cornell, Duke, Georgetown, Boston College, Notre Dame, McGill, Tufts, Holy Cross, Northwestern and the U.S. Naval Academy.
